

Food Safety of Low Acid Canning in Electric Pressure Cookers

The popularity of electric programmable pressure cookers (EPPCs) like the "instant Pott", raises concerns regarding the safety of low acid pressure canning in EPPCs, particularly at altitudes above 2.000 feet. Because under processed low acid canned foods are at risk for developing deadly botulism toxins, our preliminary research study tested internal temperatures in low acid doods canned in three popular EPPCs at three different altitudes. The results showed altitude had a significant impact on temperatures. Knowing the public risk of this practice, Extension has responded with an initial media blitz, followed by curriculum development, a fact sheet, and continued public education.


